SUBJECT: 2019 Grants Summary and Activity Report

First, some macro comments from your President. We started out the year with a very stimulating presentation from Arthur Brooks of American Enterprise Institute and his discussion encouraging personal entrepreneurship and taking risks. We finished the year hearing from our auditor, EisnerAmper, and while certainly not advocating taking risks, it was presented in a more engaging manner than in the past (thank you, Diana, for your help in coordinating this presentation). In between these “book-end” meetings, 2019 was a transition year. With Bill’s abrupt retirement in early February, the staff team filled in very admirably until we could let the dust settle and used the opportunity to deliberately contemplate the best road for the future as it relates to organizational leadership. After such reflection and numerous interviews, the Executive Committee, comprised of Jeff, Alice, and me, delivered and confirmed a plan with you that resulted in us hiring Justin J. Kiczek in September as Executive Vice President. The vision includes developing Justin as an Executive Director over the next couple of years and continuing the advancement of our full team. Additionally, in December, the Board embraced the idea of moving in the direction of a non-operating, volunteer President of the Board position (we may settle on a “Chairman” title, subject to legal counsel and possible tweak to our current by-laws), again, to be cultivated over the next couple years. Following discussions with Laura, it was agreed that she is the clear and logical candidate to eventually be the first to take on this newly designed role, and she is excited to prepare to do so.

We focused on our higher education support this past year. In April, Alice orchestrated a highly-engaging visit to Wake Forest University. The two days included our Board meeting, a tour of the campus (including Wake Downtown) and various presentations, including direct participation from University President, Dr. Nathan Hatch. In September, Drew University President, Dr. MaryAnn Baenninger, presented to the Board at our Morristown office and provided a sobering commentary on the challenges of higher education, particularly the head winds that the small, liberal arts colleges/universities face today. She also shared a bright light with the rollout of an interactive career development tool open to all students, and we listened within a prism of what we had earlier learned about the cutting-edge initiatives within the Office of Career Development at Wake. At our December meeting, Erin verbally embellished on her written December Spotlight that looked at the issue of higher education admissions practices and, specifically, a recent case of Students for Fair

Admissions (SFFA) v. Harvard University. It provided a timely discussion on admissions quotas, in this case, specifically addressing Harvard's practice as it relates to Asian-Americans, and highlighted three of our grantees, American Enterprise Institute, Manhattan Institute, and National Association of Scholars, and their efforts in this debate (amicus briefs and/or publications).

We ended 2019 with \$13.2 million in grants to 227 recipients, and an endowment of approximately \$333 million, well above the approximate \$291 million with which we began the year (following the final KA grant distribution in early 2018). The 227 figure is basically the same as the past few years, while the \$13.2 million figure represents a modest increase of just over 2% in 2019 versus 2018. Why such a modest increase in grants during a year when the endowment increased, on an absolute basis, nearly 15% (20%+ on a time-weighted basis)? The 2% increase follows an increase in grants of 6% in 2018 versus the prior year, yet the endowment dropped 10% in 2018. There is often what appears to be a slight delay in response, particularly when there is a big movement in the endowment late in the year in either direction; meanwhile, the majority of the grants had already been dispersed that year. But there is a methodology in place. Conservatively, the objective is to generate a steady, positive trajectory toward higher grant levels and smooth the roller coaster ride of the endowment portfolio, recognizing that we have short-term funding needs and yet a long-term investment horizon. Our focus has been to: a) provide consistent support to many of our longtime grantee partners; b) judiciously open up the "pocketbook" for several, outsized, impactful grants each year; and c) do our best to operate in perpetuity, so as to build long-term grantee relationships, where appropriate, and allow the next generation to place their imprint on the strategic efforts of the Foundation. Fortunately, in 2019, we had the tail winds of very strong investment markets, after a weak 2018. Also, fortunately, it has been our DNA not to "bail" when markets drop, nor take on unnecessary risk when markets rise, but rather try our best to preserve our grants budget on an inflationary adjusted basis. With discipline and skill of the Investment Committee, and yes, some luck, we have had some success in this regard.

We have also had the ancillary objective of the Kirby Alliance. Progress with this initiative also advanced further in 2019, with two positive meetings: the aforementioned Arthur Brooks' presentation, and, in September, a visit to the Kirby Episcopal House (KEH). Our aggregate \$2 million philanthropic investment between 2017-2019 has supported a wonderful \$8+ million restoration of the KEH campus of which I believe all four branches of the Alliance can be proud. It will be years before we know whether the invested dollars also reap the intention to create a better experience for non-profit retreats and a robust demand for the space. As you know, we shall gather as a Board and then as a KA group this year on April 29 and 30, respectively, at Mount Vernon. I expect we shall have a second KA meeting in 2020, perhaps in the fall.

Justin now briefly covers our 2019 grant summary details below:

Our year-end press release summed up our grant levels via program docket and geography. The finer details within this publication reveal our program docket gently re-adjusting to target percentages, after our sizable commitments to the Kirby Alliance and the Kirby Episcopal House. In 2019, we moved closer to the target percentages in all docket this year, compared to 2018, with the exception of Education, which rose above the targeted 23%

to 25.5%. All program docket were within 3.0 percentage points of target. Geographically, approximately 40% of our overall grant dollars is New Jersey-centric with North Carolina coming in after, with approximately 15%. Finally, our press release noted a statistic that is worth highlighting again: over half of our 227 grantees have received support from the F. M. Kirby Foundation for over 20 years, an incredible testament to the strength of our relationships and our humble faith in the work of great leaders in the communities we serve.

While it may be hard to trace a theme in our 2019 grants summary, given the diversity of interests and projects this foundation supports, I have noted the ways in which the subject of *character* has percolated across many of the docket. At Wake Forest, we continue to support the Program for Leadership and Character. At the United Way of Lehigh Valley, the Leader in Me program has helped empower schoolchildren across two districts to take charge of their learning and encourage greatness in others. In Public Affairs, our support of a wide range of grantees aims to restore civility to our national *character*. And of course, many of our human services grantees like Boy Scouts of America, Girl Scouts of America, and new grantee Wakeman Boys and Girls Club have been helping children reach their full potential as productive and responsible citizens. We might even say that our environmental grantees are entrusted with preserving the essential *character* of the lands we love. What does this reflect? I suspect a recognition, by this organization and others, that our impact might not be exclusively measured by the “résumé virtues,” as David Brooks might put it, of jobs placed, degrees earned, or accolades awarded. Instead, we recognize that the cultivation of humility, grace, sympathy, and service is indeed the responsibility of any “philanthropist,” any lover of mankind.
